SECTION 1 - BREEDING SHEEP **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. A statement by an accredited veterinarian that these animals were **EXAMINED** AFTER MAY 1, 2013, and found to be free of clinical signs of contagious disease shall also accompany these animals. No sheep showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease including foot rot, sore mouth & external parasites will be admitted to any show.
- 2. All show sheep must be individually identified by an ear tag or tattoo and this identification must be listed on the CVI.
- 3. The flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show, shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian. The veterinarian must prepare the CVI (AAI-13) and must state on the CVI that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease. The date of exam must also appear on the CVI. All sheep from other states must be accompanied by an interstate CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian indicating examination for health within 60 days.
- 4. Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie ID includes:
- •A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain scrapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Your order may take several weeks for processing so order tags early; or
 - · A scrapie tattoo with individual animal ID (tattoo); or
 - •An ISO-compliant RFID tag.
- 5. Dipping not required of sheep entries from officially recognized scabies free areas; all other sheep must be dipped in an officially permitted solution within 10 days of the opening date of the show.
- 6. Shipping fever complex is recommended that all sheep, except those consigned for immediate slaughter, to be properly immunized before shipment to exhibition.
- 7. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market sheep are exempt from this vaccination

requirement). All vaccine lable directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated sheep must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination informatin must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

8. An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) statement must be signed on entry form RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show condition must be removed from the fair grounds.
 - 2. Pen of lambs consists of 2 ram lambs and 2 ewe lambs.
 - 3. Flock consists of 1 ram, any age; 2 ewes, 1 yr. & under 2 yr.; 2 ewes under 1 yr.
- 4. Breeder's young flock consists of ram lamb & 2 ewe lambs, all bred & owned by exhibitor.
- **5.** A Get of Sire shall consist of four breeding animals, any age or sex, the get on one sire. Get need not be owned by the exhibitor.
 - 6. Champion Ribbons will be given only when there is more than one exhibitor.
 - 7. Entry Fee \$5.50 Per Animal.
 - 8. Only one group class per exhibitor.
 - Lambs shown in breeding classes cannot be shown in market classes or vice versa.



GOAT HEALTH REGULATIONS

- 1. ALL Goats must have an official eartag or legible breed registration tattoo.
- 2. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
- •A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain srapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Your order may take several weeks for processing, so order tags early; or
 - •An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
- •A scrapie tattoo. Goats with an official scrapie tattoo must also have a unique individual animal ID (tattoo) to meet the scrapie ID requirement; or
- •Goats having a breed registration tattoo and accompanied by a registration certificate are exempt from the scrapie ID requirement if the tattoo is legible and a registration certificate (copy acceptable) or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which lists the tattoo and registry accompanies the animal at all times during transport from the premises of birth.
- **3.** No goat showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease including caseous lymphadenitis, sore mouth, active earring worm, foot rot, warts, lice and mange will be admitted to the show.
- **4.** A statement by an accredited veterinarian that these animals were **EXAMINED AFTER MAY 1, 2013** and found to be free of clinical signs of contagious disease shall also accompany these animals.
 - 5. No horns except on Angora, Pygmy and Boer.
- **6.** An Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR) statement must be signed on entry form.
 - 7. Tuberculosis testing requirements:
 - No test is required for animals originating from "Accredited Free" states or zones.
- •All animals originating from states or zones designated "Modified Accredited Advanced" must be tested negative within 60 days prior to importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).
- •All animals originating from states or zones designated "Modified Accredited" must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older have been tested negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual ani-
